

Blanding's Turtle Technicians – Ohio (OSU)

Description

We are seeking seasonal field technicians 4/10-8/21 for the second year of a project to determine the distribution and status of Blanding's Turtles in Ohio in support of regional conservation efforts led by The Toledo Zoo, Ohio Division of Wildlife, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and Ohio State University. Survey sites are centered in the coastal wetlands of the Western Lake Erie Basin, an area recognized for its ecological significance to a variety of species, notably migratory birds and reptiles. Shared housing will be provided.

Work will entail:

- setting and checking aquatic funnel traps;
- conducting visual encounter surveys;
- collecting demographic and morphometric data;
- collecting blood samples;
- inserting passive integrated transponders (PIT);
- recording locations using a GPS unit;
- assessing habitat; and,
- recording data.

Qualifications

Attributes of competitive applicants include:

- willingness and ability to work long hours in inclement weather (heat, cold, rain, etc.) with exposure to mosquitoes, biting flies, ticks, and noxious plants;
- commitment to maintaining a safe work environment;
- dedication to accurate and thorough data collection;
- self-motivated with a positive attitude;
- respectful and professional in interactions with other team members, partners, and the public;
- ability to lift 50 lbs. and traverse irregular terrain (e.g., wetlands);
- possession of a valid driver's license and insurance.
