Student Learning Goals

Actively participate in nest searching, egg collection, and hatchling rearing for multiple species.

Demonstrate high standards of animal husbandry to a diverse group of critically endangered chelonians.

Gain in-depth working knowledge of the concepts, terminology, and theories of in-situ and ex-situ conservation.

Build skills for chelonian exhibit design, construction, and maintenance.

- The Turtle Survival Alliance is offering a unique opportunity for motivated people to gain applicable experience in day-to-day operations of a non-profit chelonian conservation center.
- Seeking applicants for full-time volunteer internships at the Turtle Survival Center (TSC) in Cross, South Carolina working with one of the world's rarest collections of turtles and tortoises. *Introductory course for those interested in chelonian husbandry and conservation.*
- Dates are flexible, but applicants must apply for a minimum of two (2) months between April and September. Extensions on internships are considered on a case by case basis.
- This is a volunteer internship position. Selected applicants will pay their own travel expenses to and from the TSC and a program fee of \$500.00 per month. This program fee covers on-site housing while at the TSC.
