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Herpetologist Job Description

This position will be based at our Lompoc, CA office, though we may consider a hybrid position (ability to work from home when appropriate) for the right candidate; however, the candidate will need to live in or near Lompoc. The successful candidate will have a minimum of 10 years of professional herpetological experience in academia and/or consulting, with demonstrated experience leading herpetological-related projects including coordinating junior staff, conducting biological surveys/assessments focused on amphibians, and ensuring documents are prepared and delivered to clients on time. Ideally, the candidate will have experience/expertise in studying frog calls using passive bioacoustic recorders, analytical software to automatically detect species from calls, statistical analysis, and report writing. The successful candidate will be responsible for conducting fieldwork both independently and in a team environment, analyzing data, and generating comprehensive reports related to amphibian population monitoring. Field work will primarily include routine night spot light surveys, day time seine tadpole surveys, placing and maintaining passive bioacoustic recorders, and performing habitat assessments and mapping. Work may occasionally include other biological survey tasks unrelated to amphibians, as needed and depending on availability. The candidate must be highly self-motivated and have demonstrably excellent verbal, analytical, and written communication skills as well as interpersonal skills to effectively interact with teams of staff, sub consultants, and clients. The successful candidate will have the ability to write concise technical documents; to multi-task effectively to accommodate working on diverse projects; and to follow through to completion all assigned and delegated tasks. This position requires work within a group and individual setting and the ability to complete tasks within tight deadlines. The position may require some travel. Requirements:

Proficiency in statistical analysis software and data interpretation techniques. Experience with managing projects from scoping, implementation, staff/budget/schedule management, and project close out

GIS experience (e.g., spatial analysis and producing figures for reports) Possession of recovery permit with authorization for handling California red-legged frog, or the qualifications that would enable approval from the US Fish and Wildlife Service to do so. Ability to work well independently and with a diverse, multi-disciplinary team in a fast-paced environment Solid time management and follow-through skills, with the ability to simultaneously work on and manage multiple tasks/projects with tight deadlines. Positive and energetic attitude Self-motivated; strong initiative Detail oriented; resourceful. The projected compensation range for this position is \$77,000-\$129,200.
